Vision loss affects not just what you see but how you feel. Yet, most adults facing age-related vision loss struggle to find the emotional support they need as they encounter grief, fear, loneliness, and other common, challenging feelings.

That's why we're dedicated to supporting the whole person at Hadley. This past year, we updated our mission statement to better reflect our approach:

Hadley provides practical help and social/emotional support to older adults adjusting to vision loss, empowering them to adapt and thrive.

Through our workshops—now numbering in the hundreds—as well as virtual discussion groups and other programs, Hadley members learn to safely navigate around their homes and communities, use adaptive technology, and gain other skills that help them in their daily lives.

Hadley members also receive support processing the challenging feelings accompanying vision loss and the changes it brings to their lives, like having to give

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up driving or asking for help with tasks that were once simple to complete on their own.

Launched in 2024, our Adjusting and Coping Together program provides a safe space for members to talk through emotions or tricky situations with others who truly understand. The Peer-to-Peer Program, begun in 2022, has already thoughtfully paired 500 older adults adjusting to vision loss for mutual support, Hadley's vision is to reach one million members by 2030

connections that often grow into meaningful friendships. And our popular Insights & Sound Bites podcast gives those who may be struggling a chance to hear what has helped others cope and adjust.

Together, we're building a unique community at Hadley. Your belief in our mission helps ensure that every program we offer stays free of charge for anyone who needs it. With the growing number of individuals facing vision challenges, your support is more critical than ever.

And because no one should have to face vision loss alone, our ambitious vision for the future is to reach one million members by 2030. Together, we can make it happen.



Sources of Contributions to Operating Funds






Bequests: \$551,043 Donated materials and services: \$134,255

Due to generous donations and prudent financial investments, Hadley's endowment covers all administrative and fundraising expenses.

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


